

## Senior Project Final Reflection Paper

The Senior Project Reflection paper is to be four pages in length using 11 or 12 point font, double spaced, and standard margins. It is to be **four pages in length**. It is to be a reflection on the service you did at your junior and senior service projects. Please include the following elements in your paper:

1. The complete names of the junior and senior project(s) agencies.
2. A brief description of the nature of the service/work you completed at each project. What did you do? What was your role?
3. Reflect on what effect each project experience had on you. What did you contribute in each service project? Was it a good experience? Could it have been better? How did the people you served benefit from your efforts? What did you take away from the experience?
4. How do you see your service as related to the idea of the “**fundamental option for the poor,**” poor not necessarily meaning financially or economically poor, but also including those who are poor because they are alone or forgotten, live with disabilities, suffer from depression, lack education, etc.
5. You may include other reflections on your service that point to things that happened that were meaningful to you, times that were special or made you feel appreciated or happy to be there, moments where you felt like you really made a difference for someone, etc. How did these projects move you toward our goal of being a “Man for Others”?
6. Criticism of a particular service project or of the program in general are welcome, but please make them constructive and specific. This is the only way they can be useful to us in planning for the future.
